

MAJOR RULES

1. Passing in Internal Assessment is compulsory for students of class I to X. If students fail in Internal Assessments their parents will be requested to withdraw them at the end of the session, certain cases they may be requested to withdraw even during session.
2. Parents must ensure that their wards do not adopt unfair means during examinations. However, If ever violates the rule, the paper will be cancelled and the parents will have to meet the Principal the following day, failing student will not be allowed to appear for the Examination. Further, at the discretion of the Principal, appropriate action deemed necessary will be taken or a T.C. may be issued at the end of the session.
3. Student who is selected for co-curricular activities, games/ sports, must attend regular practice or rehearsals as per the scheduled notification, and must participate on the final day. In case a student is unable to attend due to unavoidable circumstances the parents should give a written explanation to the Principal, at least one day in advance.
4. Student must attend certain school functions and co-curricular activities that are compulsory in case of absence on must be produced or parents must accompany their wards with an explanation.
5. Students must be in their proper school uniform, from home to school and back, on all regular school days, special class days on holidays and also when the students represent the school at external functions and games. A students may be returned home if not found to be in his/her proper uniform specially on the days of P.T.
6. Parents must ensure that their wards reach school in time. Students habitually coming late to school may be sent back home. However, students may be allowed the following day, if the parents accompany their wards with an explanation. Further if the child continues coming late to school, appropriate disciplinary action may be taken.
7. In case a student is absent for a particular examination, the parents, preferably the father should accompany his ward with a medical certificate and a written explanation, the day the child intends to appear for the written explanation, the day the child intends to appear for the examination, However, failing to comply with the above, the student may be debarred from the examinations.
8. Promotion will not be granted if the over all attendance in class is below 75%. However on ground of serious illness another 15% may be considered. But under no circumstances students with below 60% attendance will obtain promotion.
